The ASQ-TRAK2 is the authorised adaptation of the **Ages & Stages Questionnaires**, **Third Edition** (ASQ®-3) for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families. The ASQ®-3 is a parent-completed child monitoring system. For further information on the ASQ®-3 go to agesandstages.com

The ASQ-TRAK2 differs from the ASQ®-3 in several ways. It is shorter (the general questions at the end have been removed); the English is modified to be simpler; every item is illustrated; a flip chart has been added to be used in conjunction with the questionnaires, so that caregivers can follow along; and finally, in contrast to the ASQ®-3, the ASQ-TRAK is not designed to be given to caregivers to complete on their own. It is designed to be administered by interview so that it is completed together with caregivers.
